

Model for Healthy Living: focus on Faith Life

This month, we are continuing with our series Model for Healthy Living with our 4th focus area; Focus on Faith Life. Faith Life is an integral part of big central focus; your life, your community, your church.

Faith life, as it relates to personal health, centers around Spiritual Wellness. Spiritual Wellness involves being in tune with our spiritual selves...meaning we can find meaning in life by exploring how we see ourselves in the world, and feeling we have individual purpose. Many factors play a part in defining spirituality, including religious faith, acknowledging a higher power, values, ethics, and morals. Spirituality can be represented in many ways, but being spiritually well means knowing which resources to use to cope with issues that come up in everyday life. It often involves exploring and examining a variety of values and beliefs, defining personal morals and ethics, self-awareness, self-reflection, and connection of yourself to others.

The ways to exercise spiritual wellness are absolutely endless, but need to be unique to you. Some examples of ways to pursue spiritual wellness include: personal reflection, spending time in nature, find a spiritual connection or faith community, identify what's meaningful to you and notice its place in your life, meditate, pray, contribute to causes, and to get involved and

active in causes in which you believe.

Faith and spiritual wellness, or problems with them, can greatly influence our health and chances of recovery if something goes wrong. When Penrose-St. Francis hospital, Colorado Springs, set goals to promote health in the community (including local church communities), they saw the need to address spiritual wellbeing as a critical element of an individual's overall health.

To determine what people's needs were, church leaders assisted Medical leaders in developing a survey for parishioners which inquiring about lifestyle issues such as fear, forgiveness, relationships, and stress. The attempt was made to determine connections between more obvious general human health concerns and the more hidden spiritual issues that were thought to aggravate existing health conditions or slow healing.

When the program was finally ready to bring to church congregations, the participating pastor introduced this spiritual-health connection by preaching on health from a spiritual perspective. Survey questions were given. When participants were asked about what their top health care issue was, one answer was startling. More than 10% answered that loneliness was their top health issue.

Eye opening survey results showed both leaders and church attenders which of the themes most people identified with, and that these themes related to spiritual health had a greater influence on physical health than previously believed. Regrouping to focus on issues made evident by the survey would benefit the whole church community.

FROM YOUR PASTOR

Some years ago a young man looking for work approached a foreman of a logging crew and asked for a job. "It depends," replied the foreman. "Let's see you take this one down." The young man stepped forward and skillfully felled a tree. The foreman was impressed and exclaimed, "You can start on Monday!"

Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday rolled by. Thursday afternoon the foreman approached the young man and said, "You can pick up your paycheck on the way out today." Startled, the young man asked, "I thought pay day was on Fridays." "Normally it is," answered the foreman, "but we're letting you go today because you've fallen behind. Our daily charts show that you've dropped from first place on Monday to last place on Wednesday." "But I'm a hard worker," the young man objected. "I arrive early, leave last, and I've even worked through my coffee breaks." The foreman, sensing the man's integrity, thought for a minute and then asked, "Have you been sharpening your ax?" The young man replied, "Well, no, sir. I've been working too hard to take time for that."

How about us? Even in summertime our lives can very easily get so busy and so full. Instead of "easy" our lives can become driven by the tyranny of the urgent (or what we think is so urgent). Even in these summer days, when the living isn't always easy, may we take time to stay "sharp" as we go about the work of God's kingdom. May all joy be yours in believing.




CORN MAZE



REMINDER BOARD



Start off the school year right by making this wipe-off board, which can help you remember important things.

What you need:

- Adult help
- 5" x 7" picture frame with glass (available at a dollar store)
- Lined notebook paper
- Scissors
- Low-heat glue gun
- Buttons, ribbon, stickers or foam shapes
- 1" piece of Velcro
- Erasable marker

What you do:

1. Using the cardboard insert or picture from the frame as a pattern, cut the notebook paper to fit the frame. Then insert it behind the glass.
2. Decorate the outside of the frame by gluing on buttons, ribbon, stickers or foam shapes.
3. Glue one side of the Velcro to the erasable pen and one side to the frame. Then attach the pen to the frame.
4. Place the board on your desk, dresser or kitchen counter. On the glass, write daily reminders about assignments and activities.




